A little about FSN of WNC's history:

1998 –FSN of WNC was established as a parent to parent program for families in Western North Carolina by Mission staff, an host of community partners and parents.

1999 – the program became a part of Mission services within the Genetics Dept.

75% of funding comes from Mission, 25% from outside grants




Peer Mentoring


One of the primary function of the Family Support Network is to provide families faced with special health care, behavioral or physical needs of their child, with emotional support and information from other families with similar life experiences.

Stepping Stones Triple P (Positive Parenting Program)

- Evidence based parenting program
- Addressing Children ages 0-12 with a developmental delay, disability or chronic health condition.
 - Parents choose the strategies and ways they use the information to work best for their families.
 - Stepping Stones is based on Triple P's positive parenting strategies, helping parents encourage desired behaviors, cope with stress, develop a close parent/child relationship and teach children new skills.


