When reviewing a Request for Proposal (RFP), pay close attention to the eligibility requirements. You should always study eligibility information carefully to make sure your project and organization are eligible to apply before you invest too much time in your proposal.

The eligibility information in an RFP will address the considerations or factors that determine applicant or application eligibility, which can be limited by the following:

Applicant and Project Location

- Country
- State
- County
- City
- Demographic Served

Sponsors may restrict the number of applications they will accept from an applicant The number of submissions allowed may be only 1, 2, 3, etc. or there may not be a set limit.
