# NIH Issues Policy to Support Originality and Fairness in Research Application Process

The use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools can be helpful in limited aspects of preparing NIH research applications. However, it is critical to maintain the fairness and originality of NIH's research application process. The rapid submission of large numbers of research applications from a single Principal Investigator (PI) may also unfairly strain NIH's application review processes.

With this in mind, NIH is issuing a policy to outline guidance for appropriate usage of AI in research applications. To support this goal, NIH is also limiting the number of applications that NIH will consider per PI per calendar year.

### Preparing for Fund Closures: The 30-60-90 Day Notification Process

As part of our commitment to ensuring smooth and compliant fund management, the Post-Award team sends out notifications to Principal Investigators (PIs) when their sponsored funds are approaching closure—specifically at the 90, 60, and 30-day marks.

During this time, it is essential for PIs to:

- Review remaining balances and spending plans.
- Review personnel actions if employee(s) are being paid from your grant fund by moving him/her to a different fund and please follow appropriate HR policy if an employee needs to be terminated.
- Ensure recurring monthly charges are going to be ending or moved to another fund.
- Confirm with subawards that deliverables are met and final invoice is received before the project end date.
- Notify Post-Award of any changes to the project timeline or scope.
- Submit requests for budget revisions, no-cost extensions, or supplemental funding through our Administrative Action Form.
- Prepare for any final reports and Post-Award can work to provide any financial data needed for the reporting.

If you receive a 30-60-90 day closure email, please take a moment to assess your fund's status and reach out to the Post-Award team with any questions or updates. Your engagement helps us ensure a seamless closeout process and sets the stage for future funding success.

#### International Travel

If you are planning to travel internationally:

• Review <u>University Policy 100</u>, complete the <u>Policy 100 form</u> with approval from your Department, and include your detailed itinerary.

Faculty and staff inviting international visitors/scholars to campus:

• You are required to obtain the Provost's approval prior to the visit using the <u>International Visitor Approval Form</u>, which asks for a copy of the visitor's itinerary and any technical data or universityowned equipment being shared with the visitor.

## **Research Security Training (RST)**

Effective Oct. 10, 2025, NSF requires Research Security Training (RST) covering: cybersecurity, international collaboration, foreign interference, proper use of funds, disclosure, conflicts of interest/commitment, export control, and reporting.

• As a result, investigators must complete: RCR, RST, and Export Control training for NSF proposals.
