### New Closeout Procedures: Supporting a Smooth Transition

As your sponsored project approaches its end date, the ORA is here to support a smooth and timely closeout. We've developed a structured timeline to help Principal Investigators (PIs) and Project Directors (PDs) stay aligned with sponsor requirements and internal deadlines. Below is a breakdown of key tasks and responsibilities by timeframe.

ORA is committed to supporting you throughout the closeout process. If you have questions or need assistance at any stage, please don't hesitate to reach out. Together, we can ensure a successful and compliant project closeout.

### Update Procedures for Honorariums

The university has updated its procedure for processing honorarium payments. For honorarium requests, they must now be submitted using the [Request to Authorize Honorarium Form](#). The Check Request Form is no longer required.

To initiate an honorarium, complete the new form and draft a letter thanking the recipient for their time and contribution. A completed W-9 form from the recipient must also be attached to the form and letter. Once the packet is assembled, obtain all necessary departmental and administrative signatures.

After gathering the required signatures from the PI/Ao, send the full request to Ben Peters at [bpeters@wcu.edu](mailto:bpeters@wcu.edu) for grants approval via Adobe Sign. Once grant approval is complete and all signatures are in place, the finalized request should be emailed to Accounts Payable for processing.

## COMPLIANCE NEWS

### NSF Research Security Policies

Effective Oct. 10, 2025, NSF requires Research Security Training (RST) covering cybersecurity, international collaboration, foreign interference, proper use of funds, disclosure, conflicts of interest/commitment, export control, and reporting.

As a result, investigators must complete RCR, RST, **and Export Control training** for NSF proposals.

### NIH RCR & RST Training

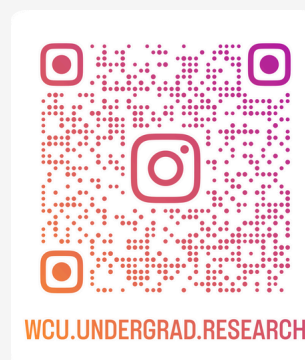
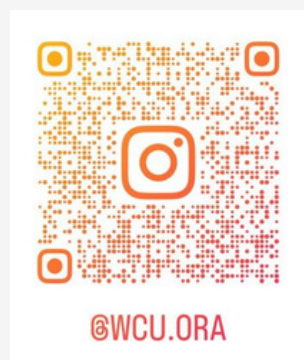
Beginning January 25, 2026, NIH will require all senior/key personnel to complete federally approved **Research Security Training (RST)** covering cybersecurity, foreign interference, international collaboration, and disclosure/conflict obligations.

NIH continues to require **Responsible Conduct of Research (RCR)** training for trainees, fellows, scholars, and career development awardees under specific programs (e.g., training grants, K awards, R25).

### Post-Approval Monitoring (PAM) Visit

The Office of Research Administration's Research Compliance may be selecting you for a random Post-Approval Monitoring (PAM) visit.

- The audits will be conducted on a random selection of non-exempt studies that have not been closed.
- To find protocols on which you are listed as PI, you can log into InfoEd ([wcu.infoedglobal.com](http://wcu.infoedglobal.com)) and click the **"Locate my records"** tab at the top of the screen. If you would like to find any protocols on which you are listed as personnel but not necessarily PI, you will need to click **"Locate Records"** then search by **"Record Personnel"** and enter your name.
