



What is MY WAY?

MY WAY is an advance care planning program that was specifically tailored for EBCI members. The program included an overview of advance care planning in a group setting, we called "Community Information Sessions." The second part of the MY WAY program was the opportunity to meet privately with a trained "Support Star" who would walk through advance care planning decisions and the NC paperwork. This was what we referred to as a "Sharing Session" and we encouraged participants bring whomever they wanted to it. Support Stars were also able to notarize the advance care planning forms.

Perceptions of Advance Care Planning After Participating in MY WAY



Outcomes of MY WAY

- 64 people completed a new advance directive
- 14 Community Information Sessions were held
- 169 people enrolled in the program
- 155 people participated in either a Community Information Session or a Sharing Session
- Those that attended both a Community Information Session and a Sharing Session were more likely to complete an advance care plan
